COACH CRAWFORD INDUCTED INTO MONTGOMERY COUNTY COACHES HALL OF FAME

The late James B. Crawford was inducted into the second class of the Montgomery County Coaches Hall of Fame on November 22 at the Westover Country Club in Jeffersonville, PA. Over 500 were in attendance. Coach Crawford's award was accepted by his wife Virginia and son James Crawford, current coach at North Penn HS.

Coach Crawford was the first inductee into the North Penn/Souderton Area Sports Hall of Fame in 1991 and the Pennsylvania Track and Field Coaches Hall of Fame in 1997.

After lettering in four sports at West Chester State Teachers College, Jim arrived at Lansdale High School in 1930 to teach and coach cross country and track and field. He was assistant football coach until 1940 and head coach in 1941. His Huskies were unscored-upon in the first seven of nine games. After serving in the U.S. Navy as a Lieutenant-Commander during World War 11 from 1942 to 1946, he resumed coaching at Lansdale and North Penn HS where he was athletic director for 17 years. His greatest accomplishments came in track and field - guiding the Huskies and Knights to 22 consecutive Bux-Mont title - 276 wins, 7 losses... 95 consecutive dual-meet victories... 18 Penn Relay titles and in his last year (I 969) the District One Title. Following his retirement in 1974, he was a PIAA official in track, cross country and swimming. The ultimate gentleman, he was respected by his athletes and is considered the dean of Bux-Mont track and field.

NORTH PENN HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS

North Penn won its first Pennsylvania State AAAA Football Championship on Sunday evening, December 7 th, defeating Pittsburgh Central Catholic 37-10 at Hershey Stadium. The Knights were ranked #1 all season and went undefeated with a 15-0 record. Congratulations to Coach Beck, his staff and players for a tremendous season!

Season Highlights: North Penn HS Team Record: 14-0 (Suburban One Patriot Division Champions; District One, Two and Four Champions; PIAA AAAA Eastern Champions). They won their second straight Suburban One Patriot Division Title and District One, Two and Four Titles. This was North Penn's first trip to the State Finals.

The 2003 Knights are the first team in school history to go undefeated throughout the regular season. Coach Dick Beck in his second year as head coach compiled a record of 24 wins and 3 losses for a .889 winning percentage. The Knights this season scored 557 points while allowing 185 points. The Knights averaged 39.8 points per game, allowing 13.2 points per game.

North Penn's regular season got off to a great start when they defeated a competitive non-league team 35-7. They went on through the regular season allowing no more than 19 points per game, and finished it off with a win against school rival CB West 41-7.
