A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE NORTH PENN ALUMNI ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

Early in 2000, a group of North Penn community members and North Penn School District representatives met to discuss the possibility of starting a formal North Penn Alumni Association. The initial force behind this idea was Art Wurster, a former North Penn Scholar/Athlete. Following several monthly meetings, criteria for membership was established -- former North Penn athletes and coaches, as well as honorary members. In August of 2000, The North Penn Alumni Athletic Association (NPAAA) was officially founded, and members of this fledging organization began to meet on the second Wednesday of each month.

Officers were duly elected: President- Al Brodhag; Secretary - Ken Schmidt; Treasurer - Russ Stewart; as well as four Directors - Greg Kobasa, Rick Carroll, Jim Heimer, and Tom Strickland.

By-laws and a mission and purpose of the organization were created with the approval of the North Penn School District. A Newsletter, *The Knight Times*, was produced quarterly for the growing membership.

In 2002, the NPAAA awarded its first scholarships, the Scholar/Athlete Award and The James K. Gulick Track Scholarship Award.

In January 2004, a new President (Tom Strickland) and a new Vice-President (Jim Heimer) were elected to serve the NPAAA. In the Spring, President Strickland (NP Graduate, 1962) presented to the NPAAA Board of Directors a basic outline for the North Penn Athletic Hall of Fame, to be sponsored by the NPAAA. It was enthusiastically and unanimously accepted by the Board of Directors. Work began immediately on the First Induction of Candidates and culminated with official ceremonies on Saturday, October 8, 2005.

A History of the North Penn School System

The roots of public education in the North Penn area predate the Civil War when simple one-room schoolhouses dotted the countryside. They offered schooling at the most basic level because all the primary grades were taught by a single teacher in that one-room environment. Students who wanted “higher” education had to travel to a town where advanced courses were available. As villages grew into larger boroughs in the 1880s, 12-year diploma programs were offered in these schools, and senior classes evolved – some with as few as a single student.

Lansdale School District was formed in 1871, a year before the community became an incorporated borough. In 1872, its first public school was built on East Main Street, where Citizens Bank now stands. The first graduating class in 1888 consisted of four students. The original school on Main Street was replaced by the larger Broad Street and Green Street schools in 1888 and 1899, respectively, but it was not until 1914 that the first Lansdale High School was built on the site of the present McDonald’s restaurant.

An influx of new industries and affordable residential housing quickly pushed the high school building past capacity, and in 1930, the school board agreed to build a new high school on Penn Street, where there would be plenty of room for future expansion. Because of this foresight, the second Lansdale High School stood the test of time much better than its predecessor. Over a period of 40 years, the campus grew to serve a total of seven towns and townships in the region.

When regional consolidation took place in 1955, the Penn Street school underwent a massive expansion project that more than doubled the size of the original school. In June 1955, the final Lansdale High School diplomas were awarded, and three months later North Penn High School was born.

Like Lansdale, Hatfield’s education system evolved from one-room schools into a larger school that began offering advanced grades during the 1890s. Hatfield Consolidated School District was formed in 1921 when residents of the borough and township agreed to erect a modern high school on the borough-township line in 1921. The new facility contained 19 rooms and was built on a 10 1/2-acre tract at Fairgrounds and Cowpath Roads. When the building opened in September, 1922, it was the first six-year high school in this part of the state. A total of 492 students were brought together under the same roof, taught by a 15-member faculty. Hatfield High featured the largest auditorium and gymnasium between Philadelphia and the Lehigh Valley. Now the home of the Biblical Theological Seminary, Hatfield High School’s last graduates received their diplomas in 1955. The high school closed its doors on June 10, 1955, and in September, 1955, Hatfield’s underclassmen began attending the North Penn Joint High School in Lansdale.

Public education in North Wales also began with a one-room school located on Main Street that was built before the town was incorporated in 1869. The bustling young town soon outgrew its first schoolhouse and a new one was erected at Third and School Streets. By the 1890s that structure also proved inadequate and a three-story addition was built to house all 12 grades. North Wales held its first commencement in 1887 – with one student receiving a diploma. The School Street building was replaced in 1928 by what is now North Wales Elementary School on Summit Street. Like Lansdale and Hatfield, North Wales became a part of the North Penn Jointure in 1955, ending the era of independent school districts – and high schools – in each town.

To come full circle, the post-World War II construction boom impacted the once rural townships of Hatfield, Montgomery, Upper Gwynedd and Towamencin much like the rapid growth the boroughs experienced a half-century earlier. The venerable Lansdale/North Penn High School was no longer able to contain the influx of new students. In 1971 a new, massive high school campus was built in Towamencin, and Penn Street was converted into what is now Penndale Middle School.

A Remarkable Story about five of NPAAA's Hall of Fame Track and Field Inductees and their Record Setting Sprint Progression 1924 to 2006

There was a time when track shoes had leather soles with $\frac{3}{4}$ inch spikes and athletes ran on 440yd. cinder tracks. In 1924 George Sands was a senior at Lansdale High School. He was the captain of the football and basketball teams. However, it was as a track team member that he excelled. As a sprinter he set school records in the 100, 220 and 440 yard dashes, running 10.0 flat for the 100yd. dash in 1924. The world record in 1924 was 9.5. George went to Penn State on a full track scholarship.

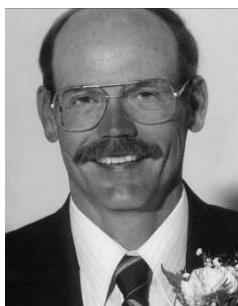


Fourteen years later not a lot had changed with the track shoe, cinder tracks or George's sprint records.



One major change that took place was the beginning of the Crawford era. James B Crawford began coaching Track and Field in 1930 at Lansdale High school. In 1938 Jack Watt became the next great sprinter in Lansdale high school history. Jack was undefeated in dual meets for three years. His senior year he was undefeated in the 100, 220, and 120yd. low hurdles. He tied the school record in the 100yd. dash and set a new school record in the 220yd. dash. Jack went on after high school to set a new world interscholastic record with Mercersburg Academy in the 4X100 yd. relay.

In 1956 the area high schools; Lansdale, North Wales and Hatfield, came together to create the North Penn school district. Track shoes had changed; the uppers were lighter, the soles still had long spikes, and athletes ran on 440yd.cinder tracks. Coach Jim Crawford was coaching and in 1960 a new sprinter emerged, Ron Hangey. Ron, as a senior in 1961 at the Bux-Mont League Championship meet, set League records in the 100, 220 and 440yd. dashes. He went on to win the 100yd. dash at the state meet, becoming North Penn's first 100yd. dash State Track & Field Champion; he also placed second in the 440yd. dash at the State Meet. At the end of Ron's senior year he had broken all of North Penn's sprint records. The 100yd. record was now 9.9; the 220yd. dash record was 21.9 and the 440yd. dash record was 48.9.



The shoes got a little lighter, the track was still 440 yd. of cinders, and Coach Crawford's unbelievable coaching career continued. In 1968 he won his 21st consecutive Bux-Mont League Championship and another superb sprinter emerged, Bill Clugston. As a junior at North Penn, Bill won the 100yd., 220yd. and 440yd. dashes at the Bux-Mont League Championship meet. He went on to win the 100yd. dash and the 200yd. dash at the District One Track and Field Championships. In the 1968 State Track and Field Championships, Bill became the first underclassman at North Penn High school to win a State Track & Field Championship title in the

220yd. dash; he was fifth in the 100yd. dash. The following year, 1969, Coach Crawford won his 22nd consecutive Bux-Mont League Championship title and his last. Bill again won the 100yd., 220yd. and 440yd. dashes at the Bux-Mont League Championship meet. At the 1969 District One Track & Field Championship, Bill won the 100 and 220 yd. dashes for the second year, helping North Penn and Coach Crawford to its first District One Track and Field title. At the State Track and Field Championships Bill won the 220yd. dash, making him North Penn's only two time State Champion; he was third in the 100yd. dash.

In the next 10 years, there were major changes in track and field. The shoes were synthetically made and very light; the tracks changed from 440yds. to 400 meters. The surface changed from cinders to all weather tracks, the spikes changed from $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch to $\frac{1}{4}$ of an inch, and Coach Crawford turned the track program over to Coach James Gulick. In 1981 Coach Gulick's Track team won North Penn's first boys Indoor and Outdoor State Track & Field Championships. Coach Gulick retired and turned the reins over to Coach Richard Swanker in 1982. In 1989 another superb sprinter emerged, Shane Pratt. Before Shane would graduate from North Penn High School he would hold every class record in the 100m, 200m and 400m, except the 9th grade 100 meters (his brother Derek holds that). In 1991 Shane finished the dual meet season undefeated in the 100, 200 and 400 meters. He won the League Championship in the 100, 200 and 400 meters, setting a league and school record in the 400 meters, running 47.4. In the District One Championships, he won the 100 and 200 meters. Advancing to the State Track & Field Championship, he won the 100 and 200 meters, finishing the season undefeated in the 100 and 200 meters. In 1992 Shane finished the dual meet season undefeated in the 100, 200 and 400 meters. He won the League Championship in the 100, 200 and 400 meters breaking the league and school record in the 100 meters running 10.2. At the District One Championships he won the 100 and 200 meters and anchored the 4X100m relay to first place finish. In 1992 Coach Swanker won his second District One Track Championship. At the State Track & Field Championship, for the second straight year, Shane won the 100 and 200 meters, helping North Penn and Coach Swanker to the State runner up team title. Shane finished the season undefeated in the 100 and 200 meters for the second straight year. Shane's 200 meter time at the state meet was a new school record, 20.9 (21.08 fat). Shane ended his career with all three sprint records at North Penn High school; 100 meters 10.2h; 200 meters 20.9h and 400 meters 47.4h. These Track records at North Penn High School stand today in 2006.



Reflections / Excerpts from a Motivational Speech by Steve Miller Presented 1/9/02 at the NPAAA Annual Meeting

Steve addressed the perennial question of the overall meaning of athletics, what athletics meant to him during his student days at NPHS, and how those lessons impacted both his professional baseball career and later life. He outlined how athletics taught him the meaning of hard work, sacrifice, desire, enthusiasm, conditioning, mental toughness and discipline – all topics frequently mentioned by many insightful athletes. Steve focused on four qualities that had special significance to him and what those qualities entail.

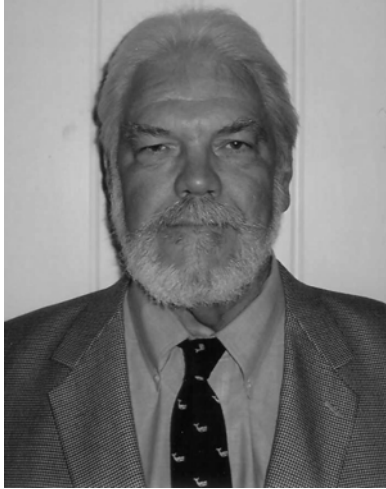
- 1) **LOYALTY:** 100% commitment to all who depend upon you. Loyalty is found within any successful team, at any level, in any successful business.
- 2) **RESPECT:** Everyone has personal goals. Respect those goals and the life experiences of your opponents, but do not confuse fear with respect. Respect your parents and the authority they represent in your life. A gentle look, a kind word, or a smile can do wonders. The American writer Herbert Casson said that, in handling men, three feelings you must not possess are fear, dislike, and contempt.
- 3) **UNSELFISHNESS:** Think of all consequences before you talk or act. Ask yourself the question, "How would I want to be treated in this situation?" What you say or do affects the lives of others. What makes a perfect day? Say or do something nice for someone who can never repay you!
- 4) **HONESTY:** It's habit forming in either case – honesty or dishonesty. Self-honesty is imperative in athletics or in any other field. You can never become an effective leader if you are dishonest – in sports or in life in general.

All of us realize that the future holds extraordinary challenges for us; we must accept those challenges as a part of life. Honesty and integrity must be sacrosanct when dealing with these challenges. There is no middle ground when it comes to honesty; it's black and white. There is NO special time to be honest. Its time is NOW and ALWAYS.

These four traits are really about **CHARACTER**, which is the foundation for everything in your life. An athlete must be dependable and consistent, regardless of the time or place.

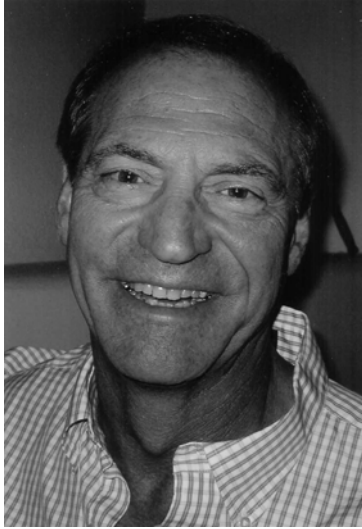

Stan lettered in Football, Basketball, Track, 220 Low Hurdles and Javelin at LHS. He was Captain of the 1934 Football Team, and won the Most Valuable Football Player Trophy in 1933, lettering four years. At Bluffton, Stan played Football and Track, where he Captained both teams. After college, he returned to Lansdale to play Football (Running Guard) for the Semi-Pro Team, The Silver Hawks, 1946-1947. He later competed in the Senior Olympics in the State of Pennsylvania, bringing home medals in Swimming, Table Tennis, Tennis, and the 100-Yard Dash. Stan remained very active in Lansdale throughout his entire life, serving on Lansdale Library Board, Grace Mennonite Church Council, Spiritual Council Deacon, Choir Director, Choir Mentor, and Quartet Member. He served with the Germantown Mennonite Board and had the Fretz Building named after him by the Bluffton College Board of Trustees.

In the opener against Hatboro, North Penn won in an astonishing 45-0 landslide! In game three, North Penn swamped Wissahickon, 23-0. (Game two was a "modest" 9-3 victory against Souderton.) The team which gave the Maidens their best competition was Upper Perkiomen, but they still lost to NP by scores of 6-2 and 8-2. After completing an undefeated Bux-Mont season with a 12-0 record, the North Penn Maidens swept the District Playoffs, winning all three games against Interboro (5-1), Ridley (5-3), and Quakertown (4-1) to gain the District Title. Game One of the State Playoffs was a win against a solid Seneca team, 12-0. Game Two saw a hard-fought win against Shikillemy, 6-3. Game Three culminated in another great win against Cumberland Valley, 4-2. The North Penn community gave a wild welcome home to this fighting team who would not be beaten.

A History

The NPAAA was founded in the year 2000 with a mission to uphold the standards and prestige of the North Penn High School athletic program and to encourage and promote higher education through scholarship awards to those student athletes who demonstrate courage and sacrifice during their athletic careers. The NPAAA has successfully awarded 9 scholarships to outstanding senior class male and female student athlete's year to date. In addition the NPAAA cooperates with the James K. Gulick Award sponsors who have provided 6 scholarships year to date to track and field athletes who epitomize qualities of sportsmanship, fair play and competitiveness espoused by North Penn High School Coach James K. Gulick, Sr. Please visit the KnightSite (www.npaaa.org) to see a listing of the names of the individual scholarship winners.

The NPAAA expanded its mission in 2004 when a decision was made by the Board of Directors to establish a Sports Hall of Fame to recognize those alumni from North Penn High School and its legacy schools who best exemplified those high standards while participating in athletics in high school.

The NPAAA is a Chapter Member of the North Penn Coordinating Council, Inc. (NPCC, Inc.) and raises funds through memberships and fundraising efforts. *As a member of the NPCC, Inc. the NPAAA is a non-profit charitable organization and all donations can be claimed as a federal income tax deduction.*

The membership of this Association consists of any alumni/alumnae of North Penn High School, the former Hatfield High School, the former Lansdale High School, and the former North Wales High School, or other interested parties.

After the NPAAA voted to initiate an athletic Hall of Fame, the Board of Directors proceeded with defining its vision. First, the NPAAA had to establish a criteria and guidelines to provide a systematic methodology for selecting inductees. Once that was established, the NPAAA established three committees: one to research, prioritize and select the inductees; a second to determine appropriate inductee awards and method of recognition; and a third to initiate a fundraising campaign to provide the monies necessary to support the NPAAA's dual mission of scholarship awards and athletic recognition.

The mission of the NPAAA is sustained by a desire to provide future generations with a historical record of the outstanding student athletes and teams representing North Penn High School and its legacy schools (Hatfield High School, Lansdale High School, and North Wales High School). This history, which provides both a source of pride and a standard to emulate, dates back to 1887 with the "Legacy Schools."

On October 8, 2005, the NPAAA hosted its Inaugural Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony at North Penn High School. Fifty-two athletes (spanning eight decades) and one entire team were inducted. The ceremony was attended by several hundred people and included the enthusiastic endorsement and participation of North Penn School District Officials. A 44-page program was provided that included the history of the schools, a history of the team inducted, and profiles of the inducted athletes. An announcement was made at this event about plans to establish a Hall of Fame Wall of Honor located in North Penn High School. This initiative was presented to North Penn High School District Officials in advance and again enthusiastically approved.

A fundraising campaign was initiated immediately following the Inaugural Event and by mid-August, 2006, the NPAAA has raised over eight thousand dollars. A vendor was selected to provide the raised metal plaques that will be installed in North Penn High School, and plans were finalized for the Second Annual NPAAA Hall of Fame Event. A total of 64 raised metal plaques (52 from the 2005 induction and 12 from the 2006 induction) will be installed; these plaques will honor 64 athletes, coaches, and unique individuals with close ties to North Penn sports. In addition, three team plaques will be included.

This Hall of Fame Wall of Honor will be dedicated and unveiled at the Second Annual NPAAA Hall of Fame Event to be held this October 14, 2006 at 7:00 PM at North Penn High School. This year twelve additional athletes and two teams will be enshrined, again representing eight decades. This Event is free and open to the public. 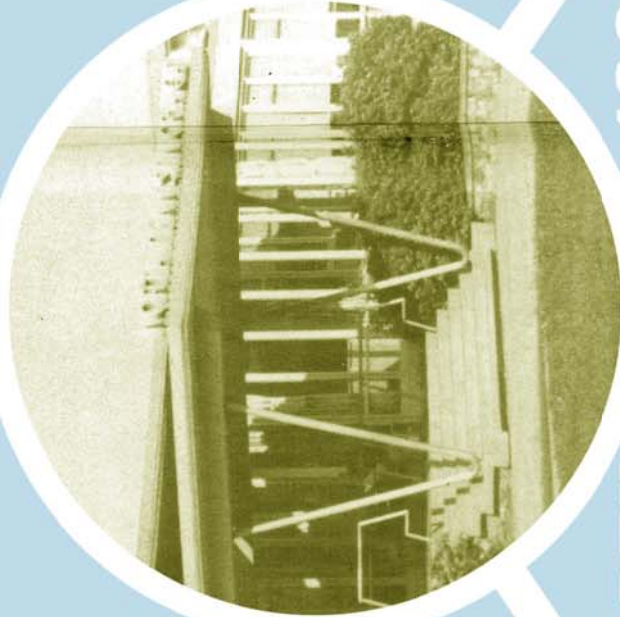
